Professional InkJet Transfer Paper for White and Light Colored Fabrics #IJP

ITEMS YOU WILL NEED

- White or light color Cotton, Cotton/Polyester Blend fabric garment. For best results, use fabric with tight weave.
- Heat Press or Iron (do not use steam)
- Pillowcasa
- Hard smooth surface (example: Formica, DO NOT USE AN IRONING BOARD)
- Store unused transfer papers in a resealable poly bag in a flat, cool, dry area.

STEP ONE - PRINTING YOUR IMAGE

1) Bring paper to room temperature before printing.

Print image/design on paper. Be sure to mirror or flip image prior to printing.

Recommended print settings:

HP – Media: Iron on T-Shirt Transfer

Print Mode: Normal or Best

Epson – Media: Plain Paper

Print Mode: Photo

Canon - Media: Photo Paper Plus Glossy

Print Mode: High

Lexmark - Media: Plain Paper


Print Mode: Best

 Do not use any printers that have heating elements in them, such as the Hewlett-Packard 1200C. Otherwise, this product works for a variety of printers.

Load the sheet into your printer so that it will print on the nonglossy (unlined) side.

HAND IRON

- Preheat your iron to the "Cotton" setting. Lay a pillowcase on the ironing surface.
- Place your garment on the pillowcase and pre-iron your garment to release moisture and remove wrinkles. Place your printed image face down on the garment (the lined side will be the ironing surface).
- 3) Using FIRM STEADY PRESSURE, holding iron with both hands and applying your body weight, iron on each area of the sheet for 20 seconds making sure to lift the iron completely when moving to a new position. Continue this process until you have completely ironed the entire sheet. Be sure also to cover all corners and edges.

4) To peel COLD, wait for the transfer to cool for at least two minutes and then remove the backing paper using a smooth, even motion for a gloss finish. To peel HOT, wait 5 seconds, then remove backing paper while still HOT/Warm for a matte finish. (Test results demonstrate better color retention during washing with hot peel method.) If you would like to transfer several images on one single sheet, it is recommended that you wait until all images are ironed before peeling away any of the paper so that the heat of ironing other applications does not affect already transferred images.

STEP TWO - TRANSFERRING YOUR IMAGE

HEAT PRESS

- 1) Preheat press to 350° 375° F.
- Press garment for 3-5 seconds to release moisture and remove wrinkles.
- 3) Place printed image face down on the garment (the lined side will be facing up).
- Set at high pressure (60 psi) for best results.
- 5) Press for 20-25 seconds.
- 6) To peel COLD, wait for the transfer to cool for at least two minutes and then remove the backing paper using a smooth, even motion. To peel HOT, wait 5 seconds, then remove backing paper while still HOT/Warm using a smooth, even motion.

WASHING INSTRUCTIONS

- Turn the garment inside out.
- Wash in COLD water.
- Use a mild detergent for best results.
- Do not use bleach or bleach alternative detergents.
- Remove the garment promptly from the washer.
 The color may bleed if left in the washer.
- Dry on LOW temperature.

Please note that transfer paper DOES have a shelf life; it lasts about 6 months depending upon storage. It must be kept sealed in its plasti bag. High humidity or dry conditions can shorten its shelf life.
